An Overview of a Highly Successful SCA Forum

The following summary was provided by Christina Despoteris, Executive Member of Sister Cities Australia and Co-ordinator of the Victorian Forum.

"The Victorian Sister Cities Forum was a great success. Over 110 delegates attended with no less than eighteen presenters. As you all know the program was extensive covering many topics associated with sister city relationships.

A big thank you must go to The Hon Bruce Atkinson MLC President of the Legislative Council and the Victorian Parliament for hosting the event.

As the coordinator and presenter on the day, I wish to sincerely thank all the speakers and delegates

for attending and making the inaugural Victorian Forum such a success.

Both Dr Hass Dellal AO Executive Director of the Australian Multicultural Foundation and Chairman of SBS Board of Directors; and Dr Vasilis Sarafidis Associate Professor Econometrics and Business Statistics at Monash University excelled with amazing presentations.

The Cities of Melbourne, Greater Dandenong, Greater Bendigo, Frankston, Hobsons Bay, the Rural City of Mildura as well as Buloke Shire, in turn, expanded on the various models of sister city

relationships including the economic development, cultural, community and much more.

Mr Kazuyoshi Matsunaga Consul-General of Japan in Melbourne also presented an interesting paper. A session on the origins of sister cities and one on the sister-schools model was also presented as well as a Q&A session. The Australia China Business Council launched "Sister City Bridge - A Report" on the day."

SCA SPECIAL ARTICLE FROM HAWKESBURY Celebrating their 30th Anniversary with Kyotamba Japan

In 1988 a relationship was formed between Hawkesbury and Tamba, Japan which is located in the heart of Japan's most historical prefecture, Kyoto. In recent years Tamba Town amalgamated

with neighbouring towns and is now known as Kyotamba which resulted in Hawkesbury signing a reaffirmation of the relationship with Kyotamba in 2009. Like Hawkesbury City, Kyotamba has an agricultural base.

2018 is also the 30th anniversary of the student exchange program between Hawkesbury and Kyotamba. To mark the occasion the following letter was sent to Kyotamba:

"On behalf of the Hawkesbury Sister City Association I send greetings of friendship to the Kyotamba International Exchange Association and the citizens of Kyotamba.

This year marks the 30th anniversary of the sister city relationship between our two communities and the strong bond and friendship between Kyotamba and Hawkesbury City is evident from the continued activities and programs run by our Associations.

Together we have run an extremely successful student exchange program that has allowed the youth of our two communities the opportunity to experience the lifestyle and culture of their sister city. Our student exchange program also celebrates its 30th anniversary this year with approximately 350 Japanese and Australian students benefitting directly from this program over the years.

I think both our Associations should be proud of the work we do and the success we have had facilitating the friendship of families in the Hawkesbury and Kyotamba. While there are differences in our lifestyle and culture, the fundamental qualities of caring for our children, being happy, healthy and caring for one another is the same and this is one of the great lessons we bring to our communities who have an involvement in our programs.

Personally I extend thanks and gratitude to the Kyotamba Association and community for welcoming me into your homes and region. I am extremely fortunate to have visited Kyotamba on a few occasions and, as well as enjoying the beauty and tranquillity of Kyotamba, I have also been lucky to have met many wonderful people and made some special friendships.

As we celebrate this momentous occasion I think it is important to look back at our achievements, but also to look forward to continuing the good job we do together.
