SCA SPECIAL ARTICLE FROM BUSSELTON, WA RIKAI (Understanding) – exhibition of Japanese artefacts



WA's new Japanese Consul General Mr Tatsuo Hirayama and his wife Mrs Sachiko Hirayama officially opened the art exhibition RIKAI (understanding) a Japanese art exhibition at Art Geo Gallery, Busselton on Saturday 5 November. The exhibition is one of many events created to mark the 20th anniversary of Busselton's Sister City relationship with Sugito in Japan.

The exhibition featured an eclectic mix of Japanese art forms, including woodblock prints, traditional kimonos and ikebana-inspired floral pieces arranged by the Bunbury Flower Designers' Club (for one week only).

The woodblock prints by renowned master printmaker Hiroshi Tomihari (b. 1936) were gifted to the City of Busselton by the artist.

"It's fitting that some of Tomihari's work will be on show as part of the Sister City anniversary celebrations because the initial sister city discussions began when he visited Busselton as a guest of the Rotary Club to run a printmaking workshop," said ArtGeo Complex Coordinator Diana McGirr.

Tomihari has been named a National Treasure in Japan and his work is represented in major European galleries.

He specialises in a style of printmaking known as modern Moku Hanga. Repetitive rhythmic contours that allude to the female form or a single standing female figure often feature in Tomihari's compositions. Recognisable landmarks and wildlife are also popular motifs. Tuart trees, kangaroos, Wave Rock or the Perth city skyline reflect his many visits to Australia.



The exhibition included a selection of intricate Kimonos and Obis, some of which have also been gifted to the City of Busselton. Among them are children's and wedding kimonos.

"We're thrilled to be showing this exhibition at ArtGeo Gallery as part of the Busselton and Sugito 20th Anniversary Celebrations" said Pauline Vukelic, President of the Busselton and Sugito Sister Cities Association. "It's the perfect way to launch the yearlong celebration of our special relationship with the people of Sugito."

Rikai was on show at the ArtGeo Gallery in Queen Street, Busselton from Saturday 29 October to 4 December 2016.

Theme of the conference - 'Innovation for Development and Cooperation for Sharing'

Over 600 delegates attended the conference from 263 countries plus representatives from over 30 Provinces in China.

The conference program was short and tight. Presenters from various countries spoke on the following topics -

- 1. Innovation Led City Development
- 2. Low Carbon City and Green Home
- 3. City Cultural Branding Through Opening Up
- 4. Tourism Innovation, the Incentive to Modern Service Industry



With 8 speakers per session a lot was presented in a full day. The first day concluded with the Welcome Banquet hosted by CPAFFC and the Chongqing Municipal Government. A gift was presented to Mdm Li Xiaolin on behalf of SCA (a book on Aboriginal art - a collection by the South Australian Art Gallery)-

Day 2 commenced with the signing ceremony for new sister cities and cooperation projects. This was followed by the Friendship City Awards Ceremony. In all 76 awards were presented to overseas cities, 37 to Chinese cities and another 4 for International Friendship City Awards of Special Contribution to Chongqing, Guangxi, Wuxi and Fuzhou.

Four award winners from Wuxi, Wuhan, Liege (Belgium) and East Java (Indonesia) shared their experiences and the programs that they have with ther sister/friendship cities relationships.

Feedback from the attendees were shared and announced as the 'Chongqing Initiative'. The conference closed by 11.30 am with closing remarks by Vice President Xie Yuan of CPAFFC (opposite).

This was followed by the handover ceremony of the International Friendship Cities Conference Emblem to the next host city of Wuhan for 2018.

Following the conference, an opportunity availed for discussions with Mr Qing Boming, Secretary General of CIFCA and CPAFFC regarding an MOU between SCA and CIFCA/CPAFFC. This was received very favourably and suggestions for possible cooperation will be forthcoming to SCA for further consideration.

CIFCA have also proposed a China Australia Friendship Cities Conference to be held jointly in China for Australian cities who have sister and/or friendship cities/provinces in China. CIFCA offered to host the event at a chosen city in China with Australian delegates to pay own airfares. Conference and other expenses will be hosted by CIFCA and the host city.

May I take this opportunity to thank President Bill Wilson and Executives of SCA for nominating my representation at the CIFCC in Chongqing.

It has allowed dialogue to continue between our organisations as well as make new friends around the globe on behalf of SCA.

SCA SPECIAL ARTICLE FROM BUSSELTON, WA Re-affirming sister city friendship in Sugito, Japan

City of Busselton Mayor, Grant Henley, CEO Mike Archer and Busselton Sugito Sister City Association President, Pauline Vukelic recently visited Japan and participated in two very special ceremonies.



The first ceremony held on the 28th of October was the official signing of the Mayors for Peace accord at Hiroshima Peace Park. Mayors for Peace was established in 1982 with the aim of achieving lasting world peace through inter-city solidarity. Our Sister City Sugito, joined Mayors for Peace in September 2010, the City of Busselton became a signatory to the global peace program earlier this year.

Speaking from Japan, Mayor Grant Henley said: "It was very moving to be in Hiroshima for the signing of the Mayors for Peace accord in the presence of both the Mayor of Hiroshima and the Mayor of Sugito. It was a very formal ceremony reflecting the City's sad history, but it was also very positive and I applaud the leadership role Japan has taken in the pursuit of world peace. Becoming a signatory of Mayors for Peace reflects our community's support for world peace and I was honoured to able to solemnize our collective commitment."

While in Sugito, City of Busselton representatives were also invited to join in the 400th Anniversary celebrations of Sugito as a post station on the old Nikko Highway, donning traditional samurai suits for the occasion.



The City of Busselton has kicked-off a year of celebration marking the 20th anniversary of its sister-city relationship with Sugito. Confirmed events include a Japanese Art Exhibition at ArtGeo (see story on page 2); Japanese Art workshops; the painting of a commemorative street mural; a BASSCA float in the annual float parade; and the
