## **TWO CITIES CHOOSE CHINA**

While Councils continue to value the cultural contribution of sister city relationships economic development is an

increasing area of focus which has led the City of Perth and Gold Coast City Council to cement ties with the new economic powerhouse on the block, China.

The Mayor of Chengdu, Sichuan Province signed a new sister city contract with Perth at the 2012 China International Friendship Cities Conference.

The Agreement states that the two cities will 'cooperate in the areas of business, commerce, trade, education, energy, environmental protection, tourism, culture and governance, guided by the principles of mutual and complementary benefits and common prosperity.' Perth and Chengdu are also signatories to an international sister cities tourism alliance.

According to Cr Scaffidi (Mayor of Perth), 'There is great potential for development of economic and social relations and I urge West Australians to embrace our newest Sister City. We live in an increasingly globalised environment and there is so much to be gained by co-operation.'

The Gold Coast on the other hand already has a strong relationship with China through their sister city of Beihai but according to Cr Tate (Gold Coast Mayor), 'by having Zhuhai as our second Chinese sister city, along with Beihai, we are sending a clear message just how much we value this relationship and our intention to strengthen it.'

Zhuhai and the Gold Coast share many similarities as coastal cities and Council intends to develop export opportunities and knowledge exchange with Zhuhai through the new sister city agreement.

## **REINVIGORATION**

Not only will the Gold Coast sign a new sister city contract with China but they are committed to revitalising their 20 year sister city relationship with Noumea.

Gold Coast Mayor Cr Tate formally welcomed a visiting delegation, saying the relationship with Noumea was an important one, based on both cultural and economic exchange.

"While we have a great cultural and information exchange with Noumea, the relationship also has economic benefits for the city. They are a market for our local boat builders and marine industry and several hundred students from Noumea come here to study each year."

'I am sure with this new agreement in place; we will be able to further enhance this economic exchange.'

Re-signing an agreement with Noumea is part of Council's plan to reinvigorate their sister city program along with the planned signing of a new agreement with Zhuhai, China at a Council-led trade mission to China in November.

## **Meeting the Milestones**

A brilliant Carnival of Flowers weekend provided a spectacular backdrop for numerous 10th anniversary commemorations of the Sister City Agreement between Paju, Republic of Korea and Toowoomba.

Toowoomba Region Mayor Paul Antonio said Council was delighted to host the Paju delegation headed by Mayor In Jae Lee and a performance group to mark the 10th anniversary of the formal signing of the Economic Sister City Agreement on October 2, 2002.

Cr Antonio presented Mayor Lee with a painting of Queens Park and thanked the visiting officials and performers for making the effort to visit the Garden City.

"Toowoomba has hosted 213 delegates, including this deputation, to the region in the past decade," Cr Antonio said.

"Thirty delegates have visited Paju and I'm positive we will continue to build on our strong friendship with more interaction in coming years.

"Beyond the economic links, Council sees enormous scope to expand cooperation for education and cultural exchanges between individuals and organisations." 'As part of our commitment to creating new opportunities for local businesses, Council has made clear its intention to reinvigorate our sister city program and we will be working to establish more new sister cities in the future,' Cr Tate.

Should all proceed smoothly, the Mayor will formally sign the sister city agreement with Zhuhai as part of a Council-led trade mission to China in November.
