CHANGE OF NAME TO SISTER CITIES AUSTRALIA

At this year's Annual General Meeting it was resolved that the Australian Sister Cities Association Inc. change its name to Sister Cities Australia and the Constitution be changed to reflect the name change.

Since then, and during the process of changing the name with the Department of Consumer Affairs in Victoria it was noted that a change of name cannot be done at an annual general meeting and only at a "general" or "special" meeting. This was very disappointing however the Executive will need to adhere to this advice and now conduct a "special" meeting prior to the next AGM in Gosford next year.

As ASCA's 2004-2007 Strategic Plan expires at the end of this year, a session was held during the Darwin conference to seek input and comment on developing the plan for the period 2008-2013.

WOLLONGONG TO PARTICIPATE IN KAWASAKI'S 6TH SISTER CITIES & FRIENDSHIP CITIES INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION EXCHANGE SYMPOSIUM – DECEMBER 2007

Once every 5 years since 1987, the Kawasaki Board of Education invites its Sister Cities and Friendship Cities to Kawasaki City to participate in an International Educational Exchange Symposium. Participants will attend from Baltimore (US), Rijeka (Croatia), Bucheon (Korea) and Shenyang (China). The aim of the symposium is to gather education professionals as a way to build on friendship and mutual understanding by exchanging information on issues involved with education and children, report on efforts made to resolve any issues relating to this and to discuss the nature of children in each city and what education should be like in the 21st century. The City of Wollongong will be represented by Ms Monica Watt, Deputy Principal and Head of Senior School at the Illawarra Grammar School. Wollongong was also represented in 2002.
